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I am to inform that the Meeting of the Board of Studies in Ayurveda Course was held on 07.11.2017 and discussed various academic matters. The decisions of the Board of Studies in Ayurveda was approved in the 54<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Standing Academic Board, held on 07.12.2017 and recorded in Resolution No:40 in the 258<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Governing Council held on 18.12.2017 which are detailed below:

POINT No.1

TO DISCUSS AND DECIDE ON IMPLEMENTING THE M.D AYURVEDA REGULATIONS, FORWARDED BY CENTRAL COUNCIL OF INDIAN MEDICINE, NEW DELHI.

It was resolved to implement the M.D. Ayurveda Education Regulations 2016, vide ref. No.11011/-1/2016-dated 10.10.2017 & 24.10.2017, on merging of PG Specialities and its seat matrix as follows:-

1.The PG Specialities in Ayurveda viz., shalakyā – Netra Roga, Shalakyā – Shiro-Nasa Karna evam Kantha Roga, Shalakyā – Danta evam Mukha Roga had been merged into one speciality ie. Shalakyā.

2.The PG Specialities viz. Shalya – Samanya, kshar karma evam Anushastra karma, Asthi Sandhi and Marmagat Roga had also been merged into one speciality i.e Shalya.

3. Two PG specialities viz., Sangyahan, chhaya evam vikiran vigyan have been discontinued.

Therefore, the colleges who had been conducting PG course in more than one speciality (for example Shalakyā – Netra Roga, shalakyā-Shiro-Nasa karna evam Kantha Roga, Shalakyā – Danta evam Mukha Roga, Shalya – Samanya, kshar karma evam Anushastra karma, Asthi Sandhi and Marmagat Roga) under the Shalya or Shalakyā department till last academic year shall now admit students for M.S (Shalya) or M.S (Shalakyā) upto a maximum of twelve seats as per the Regulation 17 of IMCC PG Ayurveda

Education Regulations 2016 subject to the following conditions.

a. The total number of seats for each speciality (Shalya or Shalakyia) for the year 2017-18 shall not exceed the total number of seats, already permitted by the Govt of India for each college, inclusive of all specialities, which have been merged.

b. The total number of seats for each speciality (Shalya or Shalakyia) for the year 2017-18 shall not exceed the total number of seats as per the teacher-student ratio as prescribed in the Regulation 16 of the IMCC PG Ayurveda Education Regulations 2016.

c. The total number of seats for each speciality (Shalya or Shalakyia) for the year 2017-18 will be such number, whichever is less, as per the criteria "a" and "b" as mentioned above.

4. The Two different departments viz., Swasthavritta and Yoga are merged into one Department called "Swasthavritta & Yoga" and the total number of seat allocations shall not exceed the number of seats already permitted in each speciality/College.

POINT No.2

TO DISCUSS AND RECOMMEND THE REVAMPED SYLLABUS FRAMED BY THE EXPERT COMMITTEE FOR THE SUBJECTS OF AYURVEDA UG DEGREE COURSES.

It was resolved to approve the revamped syllabus framed for Ayurveda UG degree courses with some suggestions in the UG syllabus.

1. In SI.No.10. Formative/Internal Assessment.

- No of Tests in Theory and Practicals/Clinicals – 2 Internal & 1 model exam for I, II, III years and 3 internals and 1 model exam for final year

- Topics for each assessment – I, II & III year – I - 40 %, II-40% &

(As per the hour wise teaching module Model exam – 100%

submitted) IV year - I- 30% , II-30% ,III-30% &

Model Exam – 100%

2. In SI.No.14. CRI Posting schedule and Orientation:-

As per Minimum standard of Educations of CCIM November 2016,

1. One Research Oriented Assignment under the guidance of institutional clinical faculty.

2. Hands on Training must include

a. Panchakarma Procedures

b. Ksharasutra and

c. Lab Investigations

3. Each Intern must have completed

a. One general presentation

b. One Clinical case presentation in each department

4. Each intern must have attended at least one National/International seminar/workshop (not exceeding 5 days in the year).

I am to request that the decision of the Standing Academic Board as mentioned above may be communicated to all the Professors and Heads of Departments for information and further follow up action in the regard. I am also to request that a copy of this letter may be displayed on the Notice Board of the College / Hostel for information of the students concerned.
