1. 3 year old male child presented with gross Hematuria, abdominal pain, hypertension and huge abdominal mass CT abdomen showed a huge heterogeneous solid left sided intra abdominal mass.
 - a) What is your diagnosis?
 - b) What is the genetic abnormality?
 - c) Syndromes associated with this condition?
 - d) What is the morphological feature?

2. A 43-year-old female presented with persistent nasal congestion with intermittent Epistaxis without resolution for the preceding 5 years. Clinical examination revealed a large pink rubbery mass, medial to the middle turbinate in the right nasal cavity extending to the choana. Radiographic images showed a heterogeneously enhancing lobular soft tissue mass filling the right nasal cavity extending posteriorly to the right anterior ethmoid sinus. IHC stains were positive for Synaptophysin, chromogranin, CD56. Keratins was negative.
- What is your diagnosis?
 - What is the morphological feature?
 - What is the electron microscopic feature?
3. 35 year old male with slowly enlarging painless cystic mass in the midline anterior neck measuring 2-4 cm in size which becomes prominent on protruding the tongue.
- What are the midline cystic lesions?
 - What is the probable diagnosis?
 - Write the pathophysiology of this condition.
 - What malignancies can arise from this lesion?
4. 50 year old male was admitted in the hospital for uncontrolled diabetes with fever, leukocytosis, abdominal pain, cramps and watery diarrhoea. He was on a prolonged course of antibiotics.
- What is your diagnosis?
 - What is the causative agent?
 - What is the gross and microscopic feature?
 - What are the complications that can occur?

2. 45-year-old lady presented with subcutaneous nodules, chronic cough and shortness of breath. X-ray showed bilateral hilar lymphadenopathy. Serum Angiotensin converting Enzyme levels and serum calcium elevated.
 - a) What is the most likely diagnosis?
 - b) Pathogenesis of the condition.
 - c) Histopathological features.

3. 50-year-old previously healthy male presented with seizures. MRI brain showed temporoparietal mass with necrotic areas and ring like enhancement. Biopsy showed hypercellular infiltrative tumor with necrosis.

 - c) Molecular tests to be done.

4. 31-year-old male presented with episodic headaches, sweating and tachycardia. CT abdomen showed left suprarenal mass.

2. 20-year-old patient, who was phenotypically female with signs of virilization presented with a tumour involving gonad. On cut section the gonadal mass showed foci of calcification.

 - b) Discuss the karyotype.
 - c) Discuss its morphological features.

3. 70-year-old male presented with complaints of difficulty in passing urine and severe back ache.
 - a) What is the diagnosis?
 - b) Describe about etiopathogenesis.
 - c) Discuss updated grading system of the lesion.

4. 38-year-old pregnant woman had vaginal bleeding with passage of grape like vesicles. Her uterus was disproportionately large for the stage of pregnancy. Ultrasonogram showed typical “Snowstorm” appearance.

 - d) What is the most common malignancy that can arise in this condition?
4. 67/F presents with post menopausal bleeding, voice change and hirsutism for 2 months. P/V examination shows right ovarian enlargement.

 - b) What are the morphological features?
 - c) How can you confirm your diagnosis?
