The butterflies in Sikkim are facing fresh threats, and the Government is concerned. The tourists venturing off the beaten track for trekking excursions are largely to blame for this. Perhaps unwittingly, they trample on vegetation and plants that the caterpillars feed on similarly when they pluck or step on flowers, the nectar which is food to butterflies is lost.

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Forest officials plan to hold meetings with travel and tour operators who organise such expeditions to "sensitise" them on the subject and caution them on the potential danger to the butterfly population.

There are about 700 species of butterflies in Sikkim, according to experts in the wildlife division. There is a rich diversity of moths also. The alpine region where trekking is particularly popular has an abundance of herbs on which the caterpillars feed. Wild citrus plants are another common host to the swallow-tail butterfly. Others feed on larval food plants such as creepers and certain varieties of medicinal plants.

The rich floral diversity at various altitudes ranging from the sub-tropical to the trans-Himalayas explains the dense butterfly population, according to Usha Lachungpa, senior Research officer, Wildlife.

The authorities are aware of "poaching" of butterflies and insects like beetles that have high commercial value in the international market. Serious steps are taken to check the selling of butterflies. Collecting and trading in most varieties of butterflies found in Sikkim is illegal under the Wildlife Protection Act 1992.

The forest department is planning "butterfly parks" to propagate the more ecologically valuable species, forest secretary and principal chief conservator of forests T.R. Poudyal said. (260 words)

In February 1981 film-maker Steven Spielberg faced a casting problem of otherworldly dimensions. He needed an alien creature believable enough to play a starring role in a movie. It had to be scary at first meeting, but still be someone children could learn to love. Most of all, it had to be unquestionably real. After eight months the director found himself looking at an \$800,000 prototype that didn't come close to combining the qualities he wanted.

Spielberg turned to artist-designer-engineer Carlo Rambaldi, who had previously created a moving alien for the film-maker's hit movie Close Encounters of the Third Kind. A few days later Rambaldi provided preliminary sketches of a figure that radiated human emotion without being at all human. Spielberg knew he was on his way to getting the empathetic extra-terrestrial he had in mind.

E.T. of course, went to charm the world. The warm-hearted alien also clinched Rambaldi's reputation as a giant in his field, a modern Merlin whose wizardry could transform scraps of metal and rubber into "living" creatures real enough to win the awe, fear of affection of cinema audiences everywhere.

The slightly built, dark-haired man who created E.T was honoured with the 1985 Alcide DE Gasperi Award, given annually to "Outstanding Italian Personalities" for his work in the movie field.

Hollywood, too, has heaped praise on the cinema model master, awarding him three Oscars.

Born in Italy in 1952, Carlo began modeling birds, animals and people in clay while his peers were making mud pies. At five he was entertaining his younger brother and other children with an assortment of puppets he made.

His fascination with things mechanical emerged in the bicycle-repair shop his father, Valentino owned. Carlo started helping about at the age of six-kept his father busy answering his constant questions about how things worked. In his spare time Carlo made clay figures. Kites and model planes. He also began painting. As he grew older, he decided to pursue art as a career.

This Act enforces smoking ban in public places and prohibits selling cigarettes to children below 18. It bans tantalising and deceptive advertisements which draw people to smoking without realising the dangers. It also insists that tobacco containers indicate with graphics the dangers of smoking.

It is never too late to stop smoking. People who want to stop can reduce the cigarettes gradually each day till they reach the no smoking stage. Heavy smokers can use some form of nicotine replacement which slowly

releases small amounts of nicotine into the body. This allows the body to adjust its dependence on the drug. Some doctors prescribe bupropion hydrochloride tablets. They do not contain nicotine but can help reduce craving and withdrawal symptoms.

Support from family and friends helps people stick to their decision to quit. But finally it is the individual will that matters. (287 words).

Their wings are formed of pigments of red, yellow, black and white, while the blues, the greens, and the metallic iridescent hues are the result of refraction. The patterns on butterfly wings are created by a mass of tiny coloured scales which overlap almost like the tiles on a roof. Their antennae are used primarily to find food and mates. They are covered with microscopic sense organs and moved by basal muscles. Through these they perceive odours, changes in temperature, humidity in the air and certain other stimuli.

A fascinating aspect of these insects is their protective colouring. Most of them have colouring that blend with their back ground (green caterpillars on grass or foliage). In some, the familiar outlines of the body are concealed by irregular patterns and patches. Some resemble the bark on which they rest and others the colour, shape and pattern of leaf veins are imitated. Some butterflies while chased suddenly fold their wings revealing the drab outside. The quickness of the action and the sudden hiding of their brilliant colours seem to make them invisible.

In some cases the wings appear ripped and tattered like dry leaves. There are also species with transparent wings which enable them to melt into the background. In some species with dull colours, the protection device is flash colouration. The butterfly suddenly opens its wings to display a flash of bright colours which startle the predator and gives the prey enough time to escape. Some caterpillars have prominent black and yellow marking to advertise their nasty taste. Some resemble the seed parts of the plants on which they feed and grow.

It widens their horizon and gives them an edge over others in social and professional settings. A good reader is one who reads fast and clearly understands the content. It takes a lot of effort and persistence to improve one's reading skills. Here are a few points that would help you improve your reading speed. One should read silently and vocalize or move the muscles of articulation like lips, tongue etc while reading. This habit of vocalizing cuts down the reading speed to the rate at which they pronounce the words. Good readers do not regress. Regression is going back to what they have already read. Apart from losing time, regression affects the ability to comprehend the matter clearly. So unless the passage has complex content/language one must not regress. If one has acquired a rich vocabulary the perception speed will naturally increase. The reason for this is that known words are quick conveyers of thought and so the tendency to regress will be less.

Another important aspect that enhances one's reading skill is getting interested and involved in what one reads. One must draw upon the network of previous knowledge at one's disposal and apply it to the present. This would quicken the pace of processing the new information and thereby increase the reading speed. It is important to be sure of the purpose of reading. This would help readers to look for specific things and prevent them from wandering through print in a haze. Depending on the purpose and must choose the reading strategy. The purpose should decide which reading- browsing or scanning or study reading would bring in maximum benefit to the reader.

Hawa Bashi was sure that her son, Hari would die soon. An emaciated two-year old with the resigned gaze of a life-weary elder, Hari had lost his appetite. Even worse, he seemed to have lost the will to live. His bone-thin legs could no longer hold him up; his mother had to hold him as Hari sat slumped under the shade of a thorny tree near the village of Shegek Karo. Bashi's own village, Bahimi, just a few kilometers from, had been bombed, looted and burned in the summer of 2003 by the Sudanese Army and the mounted Janjaweed militia, which the government of Sudan has employed to fight a more-than-two-year-old rebellion in Darfur. (Janjaweed is an Arabic colloquialism for "a man with a gun on a horse." Janjaweed militiamen are primarily members of nomadic lighter-skinned Arab tribes who've been at odd with Darfur's settled "African" farmers, who are darker skinned.)

The World Health Organization estimates that between March and October 2004, about 70,000 Darfuris died of disease and malnutrition in camps, and it forecast that between 6000 and 10,000 would die every month. This figure doesn't include those killed in attacks and massacres perpetrated by government forces and the Janjaweed. The number of dead may in fact be 250,000 to 300,000. In addition, about 1.8 million have been driven from their homes as a result of the government campaign to suppress the rebellion. The United States has accused the Sudanese Government of genocide.

Even though Bashimi and much of the other northern Darfur countryside is now under the tenuous control of the Sudan Liberation Army (SLA) and other rebel groups, Hawa Bashi and hundreds of thousands of other women and children are too terrified of government forces and their Janjaweed allies to return to their villages. They have scattered around the countryside, in the desert and the rocky hills, making new 'homes' in the shade of trees the locals call kitra. But this survival strategy has been slowly killing the weakest: small children and the elderly.

At Harefield Hospital in West London, 19 - year – old Debbie Leonard was being prepared for one of the most complicated operations yet attempted in Britain – heart and lung transplant. To overcome the formidable problem posed by this separation, Yacoub had led his team dead donor to support the transplant organs.

Now began four hours of intricate surgery by a team of more than 20 surgeons, anaesthetists, nurses and technicians. Debbie's heart and lungs had to be removed with meticulous care, particularly when serving the nerves running down from the back of her neck; the smallest slip of the knife could affect her breathing and swallowing, or paralyse her vocal cords. Then the new heart and lungs had to be painstakingly connected. "A beautiful sight – a perfect fit," murmured Yacoub as the stitches went in.

At 3 am Debbie was taken to intensive care. At 11 am the ventilation tube was extracted from her throat and she was breathing naturally. Her new lungs were working perfectly – and still do.

While advertisements can be good helpers for shopping, they do have their shortcomings. Most advertisements aim to sell only. Faults of the products or services are usefully hidden from the consumers. Hence, sometimes, we feel deceived if the product or service we bought does not turn out the way the advertisements claim to be.

Sometimes, advertisements by rival competitors can get very intensive, especially when there are many firms producing similar products. One common example is the washing powder. There are so many advertisements for the different brands that customers sometimes get confused over what they should buy. Furthermore, having more advertisements would mean that the production cost of the firm would be increased. These rises in cost are usually passed on to the consumers in the form of higher prices.

Hence, in conclusion, though I do advocate advertisements, I do not deny their flaws. Without them, we might have to buy things based on incomplete information or go through more complicated ways before getting to know the products or services. On the other hand, too many advertisements also complicate our buying decisions. So I would say that we cannot live without advertisements but we must be careful how we live with them.

Besides singing, body language also forms a large part of animals' communication tactics. Dominant hyenas exhibit their power by raising the fur hackles on their necks and shoulders. While the submissive ones normally "surrender" to the powerful parties by crouching their heads low and curling their lips a little, revealing their teeth in friendly smiles.

Colors, which are more conspicuously found on animals, are also important means of interaction among animals. In the 16th century, an age of great marine and terrestrial exploration, Ferdinand Magellan led the first expedition to sail around the world. As a young Portuguese noble, he served the king of Portugal, but he became involved in the quagmire of political intrigue at court and lost the king's favor. After he was dismissed from service by the king of Portugal, he offered to serve the future Emperor Charles V of Spain.

A papal decree of 1493 had assigned all land in the New World west of 50 degrees W longitude to Spain and all the land east of that line to Portugal. Magellan offered to prove that the East Indies fell under Spanish authority. On September 20, 1519, Magellan set sail from Spain with five ships. More than a year later, one of these ships was exploring the topography of South America in search of a water route across the continent. This ship sank, but the remaining four ships searched along the southern peninsula of South America. Finally they found the passage they sought near 50 degrees S latitude. Magellan named this passage the Strait of All Saints, but today it is known as the Strait of Magellan.

One ship deserted while in this passage and returned to Spain, so fewer sailors were privileged to gaze at that first panorama of the Pacific Ocean. Later, Magellan became involved in an insular conflict in the Philippines and was killed in a tribal battle. Only one ship and 17 sailors under the command of the Basque navigator Elcano survived to complete the westward journey to Spain and thus prove once and for all that the world is round, with no precipice at the edge.

The latest buzz word in the continuing debate about the environment is '*sustainable management*' – that means using plants and animals for our own benefit, but ensuring that enough are left alive to guarantee the survival of the species. This sounds good, but is it practical in reality? In spite of years of scientific research, no-one really knows how much damage human beings are doing to their environment. We know that they are responsible for many problems ranging from global warming to ozone depletion, and there is no doubt that they have a devastating effect on animal and plant life on Earth.

About 50,000 animal and plant species are becoming extinct every year. All species are becoming extinct every year. All species depend in some way on one another for survival. If you remove one species from this complex web of inter-relationships, we have little idea of the repercussions on the ecosystem in general.

What makes things more complicated is the fact that unlike global warming – which if the political will was there, could be reduced by cutting gas emissions – preserving bio-diversity remains a difficult dilemma.

There are also questions about whether sustainable management is practical as far as protecting areas of great bio-diversity such as the world's tropical forests are concerned. In theory, the principle should be the same as with elephants; i.e. to cut a number of trees, but not so many as to completely destroy the forest.

Sustainable management of trees requires controls on the number of trees which are cut down as well as investment in replacing them. Most tropical forests exist in poor countries which depend on logging to make money. For most loggers in these countries, making money means cutting down as many trees as possible in the shortest time. The prices of trees remains stable, varying by 4-5% annually, whereas interest rates in most developing countries can create 15% or more in returns. It therefore makes little sense, and certainly no economic sense, to delay tree-felling.

One solution could be to insist that wood comes from sustainably managed forests. In theory consumers would buy only this wood and force logging companies to go "green" or else out of business. Unfortunately, unrestricted logging is more profitable than wood from sustainably managed forests which would cost up to 5 times more to control. Consumers would not be prepared to pay the extra sum just to protect the environment.

The sad fact is that there is no practical solution to protecting vegetation and wildlife of tropical forests in the future. It is estimated that these forests contain anything from 50 to 90 per cent of all animals and plant species on Earth. In one study of a 5km square area of rain forest in Peru, for example, scientists counted 1,300 species of butterfly and 600 species of bird. In the entire USA only 400 species of butterfly and 700 species of bird have been recorded. Sustainable management represents a gigantic experiment. If this doesn't work. We can't move to another planet to escape. It's a case of one planet, one experiment!.

It has always been clear, of course that a properly designed media program uses press, posters, printed leaflets and so on, in proportions suitable to the nature of the product itself. In such a program, television occupies a relatively important place if the product is sold in small quantities, at a low price to the vast mass of the people. It is regarded as a quick acting medium, peculiarly suited to prompting "impulse purchases".

Larger items, such as cars and refrigerators, may be more profitably advertised in the press or other media which are examined in greater detail and more at leisure than television 'commercials' can possibly be. Nevertheless, in most mass advertising campaigns, the media are used in combination with each other, in proportions which tend to be more carefully and even scientifically, determined.

It is significant, in this connection, that the poster medium and outdoor advertising generally, are staging something of a recovery, after sustaining what at first looked like being a severe blow at the time of the introduction of commercial television into the United Kingdom in 1955.

Media planning is only one of the branches of the British advertising business, where most exact methods of measurements and the close study of statistical data have made considerable headway in recent years. The marketing and research departments of the advertisers themselves, and of the agents who act as middlemen between advertisers and media owners in the case of more than 50% of British advertisers business, are constantly expanding. These departments have sometime included a number of university graduates, usually with particular qualification in statistics and the movement of university trained men into advertising business is growing as is the study of advertising problems in the universities themselves, particularly in the departments of economics, psychology and sociology.

Occasional self-medication has always been part of normal living. The making and selling of drugs has a long history and is closely linked, like medical practice itself, with belief in magic. Only during the last hundred years or so, as the development of scientific techniques made it possible diagnosis has become possible. The doctor is now able to follow up the correct diagnosis of many illness-with specific treatment of their causes. In many other illnesses of which the causes remain unknown, he is still limited, like the unqualified prescriber, to the treatment of symptoms. The doctor is trained to decide when to treat symptoms only and when to attack the cause. This is the essential difference between medical prescribing and self-medication.

The advance of technology has brought about much progress in some fields of medicine, including the development of scientific drug therapy. In many countries public health organization is improving and people's nutritional standards have risen. Parallel with such beneficial trends are two which have an adverse effect. One is the use of high pressure advertising by the pharmaceutical industry which has tended to influence both patients and doctors and has led to the overuse of drugs generally. The other is emergence of eating, insufficient sleep, excessive smoking and drinking. People with disorders arising from faulty habits such as these, as well as well from unhappy human relationships, often resort to self-medication and so add the taking of pharmaceuticals to the list. Advertisers go to great lengths to catch this marker.

Clever advertising, aimed at chronic sufferers who will try anything because doctors have not been able to cure them, can induce such faith in a preparation, particularly if steeply priced, that it will produce-by suggestion-a very real effect in some people. Advertisements are also aimed at people suffering from mild complaints such as simple cold and coughs, which clear up, by themselves within a short time.

These are the main reasons, why laxatives, indigestion-remedies, painkillers, cough-mixtures, tonics, vitamins and iron tablets, nose drops, ointments and many other preparations are found in quantity in many households. It is doubtful whether taking these things ever improves a person's health. It may even make it worse. Worse, because the preparation may contain unsuitable ingredients; worse because the taker may become dependent on them; worse because they might be taken excess; worse because they may cause poisoning and worst of all because symptoms of some serious underlying cause may be asked and therefore medical help may not be sought. Self-diagnosis is a greater danger than self-medication.

Let us take a brief look at the planet on which we live. As earth hurtles through space at a speed of 70,000 miles per hour, it spins, as we all know, on its axis, which causes it to be flattened at the Pole. You would be 13 miles nearer the centre of the earth than if you stood on the Equator.

The earth is made up of three layers – a central core, probably metallic, some 4000 miles across, a surrounding layer of compressed rock and to top it all a very thin skin of softer rock, only about 20 to 40 miles thick – that's about as thin as the skin of an apple, talking in relative terms.

The pressure on the central core is unimaginable. It has been calculated that at the centre it is 60 million pounds to the square inch and this at a temperature of perhaps 10,000 degrees Fahrenheit. The earth's interior, therefore, would seem to be of liquid metal – and evidence for this is given by the behavior of earthquakes.

When an earthquake occurs, shock waves radiate from the centre just as waves radiate outwards from the point where a stone drops into a pond. And these waves pulsate through the earth's various layers. Some waves descent vertically and pass right through the earth, providing evidence for the existence of the core and an indication that it is fluid rather than solid. This, with their sensitive instruments, the scientists who study earthquakes, the seismologists, can, in effect, X-ray the earth.

Iceland is one of the most active volcanic regions of the world. And it was to Iceland that Jules Verne sent the hero of his book. 'A Journey to the Centre of the Earth'. This intrepid explorer clambered down the opening of an extinct volcano and followed its windings until he

reached the earth's core. There he found great oceans and continents with vegetation. This conception of a hollow earth we now know to be false. In the 100 years since Jules Verne published his book, the science of volcanology, as it is called, has made great strides. But even so the deepest, man has yet penetrated is about 10,000 feet. This hole, the Robinson Deep mine in South Africa, barely scratches the surface; so great is the heat at 10,000 feet that were it not for an elaborate air-conditioning system, the miners working would be roasted. Oil borings down to 20,000 feet have shown that the deeper they go, the hotter it becomes.

The temperature of the earth at the centre is estimated to be anything between 3,000 and 11,000 degrees Fahrenheit. Some scientists believe that this tremendous heat is caused by the breaking down of radio – active elements, which release large amounts of energy and compensate for the loss of heat from the earth's surface. If this theory is correct, then we are all living on top of a natural atomic powerhouse.

Among the minerals, we require chiefly iron, calcium, sodium, potassium, and small quantities of iodine, copper, etc. They are found in green vegetables and most fruits, Vitamins have a number of kinds like A, B, C, D, etc. Vitamin A is found in fish oil, butter, carrot, papaya, etc., and Vitamin B is found in green leafy vegetables, wheat grain, etc. Vitamin C is found in green chilli, green vegetables, amla, lemon, and citric fruits. Vitamin D is found in the fish oil, butter, and rays of the sun. We also need Vitamins E and K for our health. Milk is perhaps the only single item that can be called a balanced diet in itself.

Animal protein is found in meats, poultry, and fish. The white of an egg also contains protein. Another kind of protein is found in milk (casein), cheese, curd, pulses, soybeans, dry fruits, etc. Fat is found in butter, pork, coconut, all edible oils, cod liver oil, the yolk of an egg, etc. We should drink more water at least 7-8 glasses of water. Geologists estimate that during the tremors, the whole of the state moved over 80 feet farther west into the Pacific Ocean. Imagine the power of something that can move an entire subcontinent! This is the problem that the scientists face. They are dealing with forces so immense that man cannot hope to resist them. All that can be done is to try to pinpoint just where the earthquake will strike and work from there. At least some precautionary measures can then be taken to save lives and some of the property.

Artificial Intelligence (AI), sometimes called machine intelligence, is intelligence demonstrated by machines, in contrast to the natural intelligence displayed by humans and other animals. In computer science AI research is defined as the study of “intelligent agents”: any device that perceives its environment and takes actions that maximize its chance of successfully achieving its goals. Colloquially, the term “artificial intelligence” is applied when a machine mimics “cognitive” functions that humans associate with other human minds, such as “learning” and “problem solving”. The scope of AI is disputed: as machines become increasingly capable, tasks considered as requiring “intelligence” are often removed from the definition, phenomenon known as the AI effect, leading a quip, “AI is whatever hasn't been done yet.” For instance, optical character recognition is frequently excluded from “artificial intelligence”, having become a routine technology. Capabilities generally classified as AI as of 2017 include successfully understanding human speech, competing at the highest level in strategic game systems (such as chess and Go), autonomous cars, intelligent routing in content delivery network and military simulations. Artificial Intelligence was founded as an academic discipline in 1956, and in the years since has experienced several waves of optimism, followed by disappointment and the loss of funding. (known as an “AI winter”), followed by new approaches, success and renewed funding. For most of its history, AI research has been divided into subfields that often fail to communicate with each other. These sub-fields are based on technical considerations, such as particular goals (e.g. “robotics” or “machine learning”), the use of particular tools (“logic or artificial neural networks), or deep philosophical differences. Subfields have also been based on social factors (particular institutions or the work of particular researchers). The traditional problems (or goals) of AI research include reasoning, knowledge representation, planning, learning, natural language processing, perception and the ability to move and manipulate objects.

General intelligence is among the field's long-term goals. Approaches include statistical methods, computational intelligence, and traditional symbolic AI. Many tools are used in AI, including versions of search and mathematical optimization, artificial neural networks, and methods based on statistics, probability and economics. The AI field draws upon computer science, mathematics, psychology, linguistics, philosophy and many others.
