4. University Website

- *Integrate ergonomics during the pre-clinical postings for practical assessment.*
- *Basic sciences faculty members (for Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry) who fulfil the norms of Dental Council of India and those who have been associated with teaching dental student as part of the BDS program to be appointed as external examiners to conduct practical examination for Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry.*
- *Common examination centres for conducting practical examinations shall be assigned on rotation basis (supplementary BDS examinations).*

- *Environmental and occupational concerns regarding mercury in dental amalgam have prompted to phase down its use due to challenges in safe disposal and potential ecological contamination.*

- *Thereby we can have alternative exercises for both Glass ionomer, Anterior and Posterior Composite Preparations and Restorations which have minimal tooth preparations & not with any hazards like mercury & which also includes technical skills for adhesion to tooth structure.*
- *As per the Dental Council of India (DCI) Regulations 2017–18, the quota for dental scaling procedures in the Department of Periodontics is specified as 50 dental scaling procedures, which may be performed using either hand or ultrasonic instruments.*
- *Spotters of radiological anatomy shall be included in the Anatomy practical examinations.*
- *All III BDS students should be mandated to attend Research Methodology and Biostatistics Workshop conducted by the University.*

2. Uniform Academic Calendar for All Affiliated Colleges as per the norms of the DCI/NDC and this University shall be followed.
